SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

"For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." (Gospel for Nov. 10, Mk 12:44)

The lowly widow received praise from Jesus because her gift came from her substance and not her abundance. There is much to be said for the "give until it hurts" approach to charity. We ought to give sacrificially, and it is not much of a sacrifice to give away things we don't use or money we won't miss. Remembering what Jesus gave us should challenge us to greater sacrifice for others.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to prayerfully examine your level of giving, both of your treasure and your time, and consider whether you are giving as much as Christ asks of you.

Questions for Reflection:

When you give of yourself — whether of your financial resources or your time — do you give only from your abundance? What might you be able to sacrifice in order to provide more assistance to those in need? Are there any specific actions you could take to give more to others?



I ask all my Brother Knights to consider sponsoring a Wreath.





Deacon Mark's Homily

Pam and I had the good fortune to be sacristans at the 4 PM Saturday Mass Sept 28th. Deacon Mark gave the homily, and he wasn't pulling any punches. It is also all our good fortunes that this Mass was recorded. If you weren't at that Mass, I strongly encourage you to go to the YouTube channel on the COTI website and watch his homily. This is the closest thing to a fire and brimstone homily that I've heard in a very long time, not since Fr. Finbar when I was in grade school at St. Francis Elementary in Santa Fe. He was not one of the Nun's favorites when he taught catechism, he tended to break chalk boards while driving some point into our pea sized second grade brains. We all knew about him; he was a drill Sgt in WWII and when he mustered out, he went into the seminary and became a Franciscan Priest. Fr. Finbar taught second grade catechism the same way he taught boot camp recruits.

Anyway, back to Deacon Mark:

The Gospel that day was Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47 and 48. This Gospel is packed, and is basically a two-part Gospel. The first part the Apostles are complaining that others, who are not part of the disciples, are driving out demons in Jesus's name. Jesus makes the point not to condemn them, "whoever is with us cannot be against us." A lesson in tolerance we should take to heart today.

But this is not the part that Deacon Mark talked about. In the second part of that Gospel, Jesus clearly tells us there is, in fact, a Hell, and describes it in "fiery" terms, pun intended. Deacon Mark makes the point that God doesn't send any body to hell, we do that ourselves. A closer reading of the second part of that Gospel tells us, for instance, IF someone leads another to sin, he is going to Hell. So the message here is If you don't want to go to hell, don't lead another to sin. While this is just one example, overall, it really is just that simple.


To make it even more simple, as Deacon Mark says, to avoid going to Hell, simply follow the teachings of Jesus and the teachings and traditions of the Catholic Church. In today's world, driven and controlled by an Anti-God media that constantly tells us evil is good and good is evil, this is a tall order, but one we must get back to.

What makes this hard is that all of us, in some way or another, are slaves to the tyrant that is sin. Fulton Sheen comments: "The human will cannot be assaulted from without; it can only be betrayed from within, by a free decision which, multiplied, forges the chains of habit": "Very truly I say to you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. The slave does not have a permanent place in the household," John 8:34-35. Sheen continues; "the very freedom which the sinner supposedly exercises in his self-indulgence is only proof that he us ruled by the tyrant."

We must learn the lessons of the Bible, the lessons of the Old Testament that repeatedly tell us that every time Israel strayed from the teachings of God, their world turned bad, and every time Israel came back to God, their world turned good again. When you think about it, again, it really is just that simple.

In his comments on the book of Judges in the Old Testament, Bishop Barron compares today's world to the world in Judges; as he describes it, "a text marked by enough murder, mayhem, and miscreancy to put Martin Scorsese or Quentin Tarantino to shame." How we got here is the same story told over and over again since before the earth's crust cooled. We'll talk about that next month.



I am excited to share with you that the registration site is up and running for the Fourth Degree's 125th Anniversary Celebration to be held on Saturday, February 22, 2025, at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City. Click **HERE** for more information. Sir Knights and Knights from around the world are encouraged to attend this historic event. Just last week, I was at the cathedral to study plans for the exemplification, which will be the premiere of the Revised Patriotic Degree, which was formally adopted by the Supreme



Board of Directors on October 11th in San Juan, Puerto Rico. More exciting is that for the first time, the degree will be open to family and friends to learn the great Catholic history of the United States and to see their loved one swear an oath to serve our nation as a devout Catholic and Sir Knight. With the completion of the United States degree, we now turn our focus to our international jurisdictions to begin revising and updating their patriotic degrees.

February 22nd will be an incredible day. In fact, it is the exact same date that the Fourth Degree was first exemplified in New York City in 1900. Joining us will be the Supreme Officers and Directors, as well as the Vice Supreme Masters. In 1900, they had a class of more than 1,000 candidates. Our goal is to come as close to that number as possible to increase enthusiasm and energy for the Fourth Degree as we begin our next 125 years!



Korean & Vietnam War Census Program

The Fourth Degree will conduct a census of the membership to establish a record of service in the Korean and Vietnam Wars.

Following the World Wars, the Order documented war service by its members in the archives at the Blessed Michael J. McGivney Pilgrimage Center however similar efforts were not conducted following either the Korean or Vietnam Wars.

The Korean War commenced in 1950, making the approximate minimum age of surviving veterans ninety-one years old. The approximate minimum age of surviving Vietnam veterans serving from 1965-1973 is 68-76 years old. Both the Korean and Vietnam Wars marked a significant departure in how troops served and returned from war, as service was no longer for the duration. Gone were the hero's welcome on return. Vietnam veterans returned to a hostile and divided nation, where they were either overlooked or criticized for their service.

For Assemblies working in conjunction with their assigned councils in conducting the census of their membership please use the most current form;

Where possible, documented service of deceased members needs to be recorded. Inclusion in the census shall be limited to veterans meeting the requirements established by Congress for the Korean Service Medal you must have served from June 25, 1950, to July 27, 1953, and was on permanent assignment or on temporary duty for 30 consecutive days or 60 non-consecutive days and performed his duty within the country of Korea. For the Vietnam Service Medals, you must of served from July 3 1965 to March 28 1973 and was on temporary duty for at least 30 consecutive days or 60 non-consecutive days or have served in combat with a unit directly supporting a military operation in Southeast Asia (Vietnam and the contiguous waters and airspace in Thailand, Laos, or Cambodia; or the airspace thereof and in the direct support of military operations in Vietnam.

Certificates recognizing service will be delivered to surviving veterans via their councils. District Masters, it is recommended that you reach out to all your Faithful Navigators to collaborate with their local Grand Knights to hold a party or dinner for those Veterans receiving the certificate. There should also be a 4th Degree Honor Guard present during the certificate presentation. Let us show our appreciation to those veterans in our council who served in these two wars and to let them know that their sacrifices are not forgotten.

Wearing of the Uniform

I received an email from a new District Master last week. He had a question from a member of one of his assemblies and was unsure how to answer, which was:

Could he wear the Fourth Degree uniform blazer with other slacks and a regular tie when going out with this wife? The answer is: No

Our uniform was designed to be worn complete with the Fourth Degree blazer, official slacks, tie, and official Fourth Degree pin (PG-113). It also requires a white dress shirt with no button-down collar, black shoes, and black socks. However, it may be worn in social settings such as Knights of Columbus events, banquets, exemplifications, meetings, and church.

The other components of the uniform are used when participating in our color corps (color guard or honor guard). Those include the official beret with flash representing office (if any), white gloves, a service baldric, a Fourth Degree sword with scabbard. Flag bearers would not wear baldric or sword. (Note that the service baldric is either a general member baldric or else a specific color to indicate your current office held).

So, if you want to show your pride as a member of the Fourth Degree, then wear all the components according to the laws and rules of the Fourth Degree.




