This liturgical year the Season of Lent begins with ashes on Wednesday, March 1, 2017, and climaxes with Mass on Holy Thursday, April 13, 2017. Lent is the Church's forty-day (the six Sundays are not counted) spiritual pilgrimage toward Easter. Christ Himself prayed and fasted for forty days and forty nights in the desert before He entered His public ministry, and in Lent we imitate Christ's days of prayer and fasting in preparation for our redemption.

Originally, the period before Easter was a time of study and prayer for those preparing to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. Today, the Church invites us not only to pray for catechumens but also to renew our own commitment to the life that began in us at Baptism. We observe Lent as a season of spiritual development marked by prayer, penance, fasting, charity, and introspection as we seek to recognize and respond afresh to God's presence in our lives. We enter Lent with the hope that Christ will become more meaningful to us and that we will be more Christ-like to others.

CELEBRATING OUR FOUNDER



The Knights of Columbus Supreme Council marked the 135th anniversary of the founding of the Order at a Mass on March 29 in St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Conn. The church is the site where Father Michael J. McGivney first gathered a group of Catholic men from the parish with the goal of providing for families of deceased breadwinners. March 29 marks the day when the organization received approval of its charter from the state of Connecticut in 1882.

"There is something timeless about people who are holy, because their lives speak to each new generation. Such is the case with Father McGivney," Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore said in his homily. "Father McGivney's priestly holiness is timeless and is just as relevant for us today as it was when he ministered to the people in this very church."

The supreme chaplain continued that like Pope Francis' example of charity today, Father McGivney was a man of mercy and charity.

Concelebrating with the archbishop were Msgr. J. Peter Cullen, Connecticut state chaplain; Dominican Father Jonathan D. Kalisch, director of Chaplains and Spiritual Development and prior of St. Mary's Dominican Community; Dominican Father John Paul Walker, pastor of St. Mary's Parish; Father Joseph A. Marcello, pastor of St. Catherine of Siena Parish in Trumbull and priest-secretary emeritus to the supreme chaplain; and Dominican Father Marek Domeradzki of Poland. Father Louis Bianco was the master of ceremonies.

Attending the Mass were relatives of Venerable Michael J. McGivney and Knights from Connecticut. John Walshe, great-grandnephew of Father McGivney, and Kay Walshe, were the gift bearers for the Mass. Brian V. Caulfield, vice-postulator for the cause for the canonization of Father McGivney, served as the lector.

After Mass, Archbishop Lori led supreme officers and their wives to the sarcophagus of Father McGivney located in the rear of the church, where they recited the Prayer for Canonization along with the congregation. The prayer was written in 2008, when the Vatican recognized the heroic virtue of Father McGivney and declared him a venerable Servant of God. A miracle attributed to his intercession is needed for him to advance to beatification.

Integrity in the Ministry (2 Cor 4; Ref. Fireside Bible)

Dear Brothers in Christ, I have been reading and studying a section of the Bible that applies to our ministry of the Knights and to all disciples in ministry. Saint Paul, who I wrote about last month, is the author of this second letter to the Corinthians. Remember Paul was originally an enemy of the first Christians and most likely responsible for the death of the first martyr, St. Stephen. Through Christ, Paul realized his error and became one of the most effective ministers of the early Church.

(2 Cor 4; 1-2) *"Therefore, since we have this ministry through the mercy shown us (from Jesus), we are not discouraged. Rather, we have renounced shameful, hidden things; not acting deceitfully or falsifying the word of God, but by the open declaration of the truth we commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God."* Jesus has called us into ministry as Brothers to renounce shameful, hidden things and to not act deceitfully. We must openly declare the truth to everyone we meet.

(2 Cor 4; 3-4) *"And even though our gospel is veiled, it is veiled for those who are perishing, in whose case the god of this age (who is Satan) has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, so that they may not see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God."* This section made me think of just how many people in the secular world today do not know or believe in Christ because it is Satan that blinds their minds through sin. Satan is attacking our families and our church and in order to prevail we must pray unceasingly, go to confession frequently, and receive the Eucharist as often as possible so that He may continue to nourish our bodies and our souls. Warriors must be nourished in order to fight the fight!

(2 Cor 4; 5-7) *"For we do not preach (about) ourselves but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your slaves for the sake of Jesus. For God who said 'Let light shine out of darkness' has shone in our hearts to bring to light the knowledge of the glory of God on the face of [Jesus] Christ. (This is) the Paradox of the Ministry. But we hold this treasure in earthen vessels, that the surpassing power may be of God and not from us."* Paul said, 'We do not preach ourselves but Jesus Christ as Lord.' Paul is saying that when we are ministering to His people that we are to be transparent so that it is Jesus who is perceived through us. We cannot do this if we are serving others all the while patting ourselves on the back and expecting praise and glory. We must serve with the mindset that 'I must be LAST so that He can be FIRST!

(2 Cor 4; 8-10) *"We are afflicted in every way, but not constrained; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying about in the body the dying of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our body."* Many of us Brothers who read this section may think, 'but I am a Knight and I have prevailed...I have overcome!!' All of us are Catholics in good standing with the Church otherwise we would not have been accepted into the Knights in the first place. However, we must not fool ourselves into thinking we are perfect Catholics. Always remember that you are NOT perfect but strive to be so. I oftentimes hear my fellow Brothers talking negatively about other Brothers or family members. I have sensed jealousy, pride, unforgiveness, envy, competitiveness, criticism, impatience, resentment, anger, distrust, and division. We must remember that we are all on the same journey...and we will not succeed unless we lift each other up and not bring each other down.

(2 Cor 4; 11-14) *“For we who live are constantly being given up to death for the sake of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So, death is at work in us, but life in you. Since, then, we have the same spirit of faith, according to what is written, “I believed, therefore I spoke,” we too believe and therefore speak, knowing that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and place us with you in his presence.”* We must continue to have faith that just as the Father raised up Jesus, he will also mold us into perfection and then raise us up as he did His Son.

We must strive to be the perfect servant, just like Jesus, if we want to join Him in Heaven.

2 Cor 4; (15-18) *“Everything indeed is for you (Lord), so that the grace bestowed in abundance on more and more people may cause the thanksgiving to overflow for the glory of God. Therefore, we are not discouraged. Rather, although our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this momentary light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to what is seen but to what is unseen; for what is seen is transitory, but what is unseen is eternal.”* We must remember that a Knight is called to serve...and not necessarily to be seen. The more people we serve...the more people will see the Glory of God through us! This Knights of Columbus has been a blessing to me and I am proud to be part of this wonderful group of men. But we must continually remind ourselves why we are here.

NMSC Annual Charity Raffle

The NMSC Annual Charity Raffle has been revamped with changes that will allow all councils the ability to earn even greater profits for their charitable projects: Providing \$10,000 in prizes, including a \$5,000 Grand Prize and five \$1,000 prizes. Tickets are priced competitively at \$5 each.

Additionally, the following council incentives are being offered:

- The council that sells the Grand Prize Ticket receives \$1,000.
- The council that sells the most tickets receives \$1,000.
- The council that sells the most tickets per member receives \$1,000.

While this revamped fundraiser has the potential to become a Million-Dollar Raffle, we have set a modest goal of \$100,000 in gross ticket sales statewide this year. While at first glance this goal may seem like a mammoth task, when spread across our jurisdiction's membership, this target comes out to just over two tickets per member—a most achievable goal. The ticket split remains at 50% for the council so that it can make donations to the local charities of their choice. The other 50% will go to the state organization to cover raffle administration costs, legal requirements and prizes. The remaining balance goes to funding charitable needs at the state level.

Supreme Council Office

The Knights of Columbus international headquarters is located in New Haven, Connecticut. Led by the Supreme Knight, the chief executive officer of the Knights, the office provides administrative support and leadership for our more than 15,000 local units.

Jurisdictions

Statement on the Dignity of Human Life March 6, 2017

We the bishops of the State of New Mexico speak for the Catholic Church. We work to uphold the dignity of the human person from conception to natural death through our pastoral ministries and through our legislative advocacy via the New Mexico Conference of Catholic Bishops. We encourage individuals to live and proclaim their faith; however, they must be steadfast in stating they speak for themselves and do not speak for the Catholic Church. Recently, statements have been made by some Catholic legislators regarding abortion, doctor-assisted suicide and the Catholic Church. These statements may be confusing to the Catholic faithful and do not represent the teachings of the Church. It is not appropriate for elected officials to publicly invoke their Catholic faith and to present their personal opinions as official Church teaching. This misrepresents Church teaching and creates a public scandal for the faithful. Furthermore, this action publicly separates a person from communion with the Catholic faith. We acknowledge that there are Catholic legislators who advocate and vote for some issues that are of moral importance to Catholics, including concern for poor people and immigrants. We applaud their work giving voice to the voiceless. However, we are concerned by public statements by some legislators that seem to say that a faithful Catholic can support abortion or doctor-assisted suicide. Support for abortion or doctor-assisted suicide is not in accord with the teachings of the Church. These represent the direct taking of human life, and are always wrong. Furthermore, we are convinced that proclaiming and living the Gospel of Jesus Christ is the most effective way to change hearts and minds so that one day the scourge of abortion will be eliminated. Our message is consistent: All human life is sacred, from the moment of conception to natural death, and must be protected. As Pope Francis reminds us, "Even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation, made in His own image, destined to live forever, and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect (7/17/13)." It is not morally permissible for a Catholic to support abortion or doctor-assisted suicide.

We also acknowledge that God's forgiveness is always available to us if we seek it, so that we may heal our soul and be reconciled with God, the Church and others.

This is the case with abortion. Those who have had an abortion, participated in an abortion, or otherwise supported an abortion need to seek reconciliation with God and the Church through the sacrament of reconciliation. The Project Rachel ministry of the Catholic Church offers this hope for healing and reconciliation to men and women who have had or participated in an abortion. We want to be clear. Individuals and groups do not speak for the Catholic Church. As bishops, we do. The Archdiocese of Santa Fe, the Diocese of Las Cruces and the Diocese of Gallup continuously preach Jesus' Gospel of Life in public and in private meetings with legislators. We visit the New Mexico Legislature when it gathers and host a time when together the priorities of the Church are made known to the legislators. We take the Gospel to the public square in public meetings and hearings as well as in private meetings and conversations with elected officials. We pray for all legislators and through the New Mexico Conference of Catholic Bishops are here to aid in the formation of consciences. We will continue to collaborate with many others to uphold the dignity of the human person through a consistent ethic of life from conception to natural death.

Good Friday, April 14: **Everyone please be there for the Jericho Walk for Life!**

The **Annual Jericho Walk for Life** will be held on **Good Friday**, April 14th. It starts at 9 AM and will be held just North of the Planned Parenthood at 701 San Mateo Blvd NE, our prayer gathering will be behind the State Farm building and we will have seven prayer processions that morning around Planned Parenthood's abortion mill. There will be a piece of the True Cross that Christ was crucified on there for veneration, and we will sing hymns, pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet to start the Novena, do the Stations of the Cross, view the NM Pray for Life Quilt, and much more. Please plan to attend and defend innocent lives from being lost.

NM 2017 Legislative Session Adjourns, Anti-Life Bills Defeated!" A big '**thank you**' to all our pro-life champions in the legislature, our coalition partners including the American Academy of Medical Ethics, The NM Conference of Catholic Bishops, Right to Life Committee of New Mexico, the HUB of New Mexico and all who showed up to testify, send emails, and make phone calls. As we continue to work together in a unified effort, we will see New Mexico change from a culture of death to a culture of life."

"Thanks to your phone calls, emails and hard work, SB 282, the so-called 'Hospital Patient Protections Act,' was never heard on the Senate floor. SB 282 would have forced Christian health care professionals to refer patients for abortions and religiously-affiliated hospitals to perform abortions across New Mexico."

"HB473 was an aggressive abortion measure that aimed to decriminalize abortion, allowing non-physicians to perform abortions. Sadly, the unconstitutional measure also sought to remove New Mexico statute that protects healthcare providers from participating in an abortion against their religious or moral objections."

"Physician Assisted suicide, in the form of HB 171 and SB 252, the 'End of Life Options Act', also failed in both the Senate and House."
