

Political Correctness

Whenever Jesus acts, he acts because it's the right thing to do, never simply because it's the politically correct thing to do. One thing we can never accuse Jesus of is "political correctness." In the earlier mentioned Gospel passages, the politically correct thing for him to have done was, not to have cured on the Sabbath, not to have ridiculed the Pharisees' honor-seeking game, not to have urged the Pharisees to invite the outcasts of society to their parties. Jesus' behavior was never determined by political correctness.

Political correctness can limit the degree to which we can become Christ-like. It can prevent us from reaching out as Jesus did to those people whose local, family or class culture insists are socially unacceptable. Pride is an insistent accomplice of political correctness and is a powerful motivating force urging us to never associate, for instance, with former prisoners, or only with those who are "cultured," wealthy, and powerful.

Jesus' example provides us with a challenge to make ourselves available to all men and women, no matter how badly society has treated them or how badly they have treated society or themselves.

The New Fourth Degree Uniform

Just before Thanksgiving, Supreme announced a significant change to the timeline regarding the implementation of the new Fourth Degree uniform.

To date, there have been over **8,000** orders placed for the uniform and deliveries are significantly backlogged. Because of this, Sir Knights who currently possess Full <u>Regalia</u> (tuxedo ensemble, cape, chapeau, service baldric and sword, white gloves) will be authorized to wear this combination until June <u>30, 2019</u> which is a 12-month extension to the original phase-out date of June <u>30, 2018</u>.

The 25% discount for ordering the new uniform was extended to November 30, 2017 – I just received an email from our VSM verifying that the discount will not be extended beyond that date. Because of the backlog, no payment will be required for your order until you are notified by Knights Gear that it is ready for shipment. Be sure you fill-in the Pre-order Contact Information box on the Pre-Order Fourth Degree Dress Uniform page at the *Knights Gear* online website.

White Shirts

A plain white, long-sleeve dress shirt (plain collar – no button down, no French cuffs) is required when wearing the new Fourth Degree uniform.

If you are a Sir Knight or Patriotic Degree candidate and wear a dark suit, you need to wear a white, long-sleeve dress shirt; however, the shirt can have a button-down collar and/or French cuffs. You should wear a long tie **or** bow tie with the suit and if you choose to wear your Fourth Degree social baldric, it is worn <u>across</u> the long tie.

Patriotic Exemplification

The Patriotic Exemplification that occurred on Saturday, November 4, 2017 at Our Lady of the Annunciation Parish in Albuquerque resulted in **22** candidates from NM councils joining eight of our Assemblies. In addition, **four** Knights from council #9504 at Cannon AFB were exemplified in Amarillo TX by the Texas #5 MFD on October 21st and will be included in New Mexico's rolls. Our provincial VSM Mike Kingman attended our exemplification and PGK/PFN Nestor Griego from Grant's assembly #2218 was the class honoree.

The next NM Patriotic Exemplification that was scheduled for **January 6**, **2018** in Espanola is **cancelled** at the request of the host Los Padres Assembly #1982. Finding another locale and host assembly for the January 6 date is not feasible at this late date so the exemplification will be rescheduled to **either February 10**th **or 17**th, **2018**. **Location to be determined.** There is an exemplification scheduled for Las Cruces on March 10th.

Saint Vincent DePaul Food and Coat Drive

Thank you to all who contributed to the SVDP Food and Coat Drive. The Food and Coats that were collected at three Parishes - The Church of the Incarnation, St. John Vianney and St. Thomas Aquinas have been distributed. Food Collected included: 740 turkeys, 6 hams, 2 chickens, 671 frozen pies, 13,161 lbs. frozen goods and 6329 lbs. of Thanksgiving food items

Coats collected included: 553 coats, 32 winter vests, 220 sweat shirts, hoodies, or sweaters and 407, hats/gloves/scarves

Your generosity assisted 597 families and a total of 2,350 people.

Did You Know? EARLY GROWTH: 1900-1910



Along with the addition of "patriotism" to the Knights' principles came the first Fourth Degree exemplification, which took place Feb. 22, 1900, in New York City, with 1,100 Knights participating. A similar event took place in Boston in May with another 750 candidates taking the patriotic degree.

By the beginning of the 20th century, the fledgling Order was growing dramatically. Councils had been chartered throughout the United States and Canada, and international expansion continued to Mexico and the Philippines in 1905, along with Cuba and Panama in 1909.

The Knights also turned their attention to college campuses, and in more ways than one. In 1904, more than 10,000 Knights and their families attended ceremonies at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., in which the Order presented the school with a grant for more than \$55,000. The funds, used to establish a K of C chair of American history, began a long history of support for CUA. In addition, students at the University of Notre Dame in Indiana soon organized their own K of C council. Chartered in 1910, Notre Dame Council 1477 was the Order's first college council, launching a subset of the Knights that today includes councils at 244 schools worldwide.

1900: The first exemplification of the Fourth Degree takes place on Feb. 22, 1900, in New York City; 1,100 Knights receive the degree. The following May, another 750 Knights take the degree in Boston.

1904: More than 10,000 Knights and their families attend ceremonies at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., in which a check for \$55,633.79 is presented to the school for the establishment of a K of C chair of American history. From 1909 to 1913, Knights raise \$500,000 to establish a permanent endowment for CUA.

1905: The first council in the Philippines — Manila Council 1000 — is chartered by U.S. citizens after the Spanish-American War. The same year, the Order expanded to Mexico, establishing Guadalupe Council 1050 in Mexico City.

1909: U.S. workers in the Canal Zone institute Balboa Council 1371 in Panama City. A degree team from Mobile, Ala., then visits Cuba and institutes San Agustin Council 1390 in Havana.

1909: A reported 5,000 Knights meet James A. Flaherty's train in Philadelphia in 1909 when he arrives at the annual convention where he is elected supreme knight.

Culture of Life From Brother Curt Kuper, Project Defending Life

Recovering

Dear Friends of Project Defending Life,

Just after midnight that destroyed our Holy Innocents Chapel and rendered the rest of the building unusable from smoke and water damage. As I waited in the cold parking lot behind the building, I wondered how quickly we could get back on our feet and resume helping unfortunate and abortion-vulnerable women.



Over the next week, other fires were set at The Carlisle (an apartment building in Nob Hill), Starbucks, Barnes and Noble, and Old Navy. The arsonist, David Hickman, was captured, arraigned and charged with the string of fires. He has since pleaded guilty and is awaiting sentencing on five charges. The federal prosecutor has asked PDL and the other victims to write a statement of loss that will be considered in formulating Hickman's sentence, which could range from 5-20 years for each charge. Please pray for this benighted young man; he, too, is a victim of his own disordered thinking.



In the immediate aftermath of the fire, our friends at Care Net offered us office space to gather our thoughts and start planning our recovery, and they also graciously accepted all clients referred by the Sidewalk Advocates. Thankfully, we had insurance on our contents, but that was just the beginning of this year-long journey. Fr. Young at Queen of Heaven offered us their conference room any time we needed it for staff meetings and planning sessions. A restoration company inventoried and packed up all our possessions and put them in storage. Within a couple of weeks, Mike and Maria from Doughty Enterprises offered us donated office space to continue our mission as a pregnancy resource center. We bought a couple of pieces of furniture and called all our clients to let them know our new location – we were back in business.

Or so we thought. It is amazing how closely tied to our location, just next to Planned Parenthood, we were. Although we tried to get the word out to everyone, we gradually lost volunteers, clients and donors. We kept thinking we would go back to our original location soon, soon – but we could not come to reasonable terms with our landlord and eventually terminated the lease in April. Now we had to start searching for a new location and opinions varied widely on what was "suitable" for us. Some wanted us next to an abortion mill, some wanted us closer to other support organizations. We worked with a very patient commercial real estate agent and looked at multiple properties, but none quite matched the "vision" we had for rebuilding Project Defending Life and our pregnancy resource center, Women's Pregnancy Options.

During the summer, and by the grace of God, a small building just north of Planned Parenthood became vacant. We signed a lease and started the process of occupying the building in September. Fr. Daniel Williamson, CFR, is working to make modifications to the building that will become our new administrative office. Although half the size of the former location, 729 San Mateo allows us to install a small chapel, with a nice reception area, two client advocacy rooms, an admin office, and even an ADA-compliant restroom! We hope to occupy the new building by January, offering Mass on a regular basis at the new Holy Innocents Chapel and providing services that will allow pregnant women to save themselves and their babies.



The blessings of the year have come in the generosity of people. As mentioned, Mike and Maria Doughty have provided much-needed office space at no cost to us for this year. Dan and Laura Rosecrans organized a wonderful fundraising dinner, as did Mary and Jay Benze at Prince of Peace. The Knights of Columbus at several parishes have been deeply committed to our restoration, offering both financial and material support.

DISABILITY INCOME INSURANCE

What is it?

Disability income insurance helps replace lost income when you are unable to work due to a disability resulting from an illness or accident.

Who needs it?

Disability income insurance helps protect your most important financial asset – your paycheck – so it should be an important part of every family's planning. Long-term disability is much more common than other unfortunate circumstances that are commonly covered by insurance. Consider the fact that you face a 1 in 100 risk of losing your home to a fire [1], but a 1 in 4 risk of suffering a long-term disability [2].

Despite the odds and the prevalence of long-term disability – nearly 11 million Americans are receiving federal disability benefits^[3] – more than 100 million Americans are without private disability income insurance.^[4] In addition, any disability income insurance you may have through your employer may very well be insufficient or contingent on certain circumstances (like worker's compensation).

How does it work?

Knights of Columbus disability income insurance policies provide a monthly benefit amount over the course of a maximum benefit period (see below) designed to help replace the income that you would have otherwise received if you were able to work. You are free to use your disability income benefits in whatever way you see fit – just like you would with your own paycheck.

Knights of Columbus Disability Income policies also come with special features, such as the total, partial, or presumptive disability income benefits, which help protect against special circumstances. As an added bonus, our disability income insurance policies come with a waiver of premium provision, which waives your policy's premiums while you're suffering from a disability.

What options do I have?

Benefit Period

The maximum benefit period is the longest period for which monthly disability benefits are payable for any one period of a disability. The benefit resets once the disability concludes. You may choose from:

2-Year – Protect your paycheck with two years of disability income payments.

5-Year – Protect your paycheck with five years of disability income payments.

To Age 67 – Protect all your working years with disability income payments until you reach retirement age.

Monthly Benefit

Working with your Knights of Columbus field agent, you establish the monthly benefit amount that the policy provides, based on your income and subject to certain limits.

Elimination Period

Disability income insurance policies come with an elimination period, which serves as your deductible or out-of-pocket amount. You can select a 30, 90, or 180-day elimination period, after which time your benefits will begin to be paid.

Additional Features and Benefits

A number of special features and benefits – often called **riders** – are available on Knights of Columbus disability income insurance products. For instance, the catastrophic disability rider provides an additional monthly benefit in the event of a catastrophic disability, and the cost of living adjustment rider helps your monthly benefit keep pace with inflation during a long-term disability.
